A. Groesbeck et al
 In the State of Texas I know all men by these presents that we Abraham
 Groesbeck et al
 County of Harris
 Houston & Texas Central R.R. Co.
 Trustees, in witness the legal title is vested to
 that certain tract or parcel of land situated in the county of Dallas State of Texas which we
 have caused to be laid off into lots and blocks and streets and alleys under the name of
 Richardson in accordance with the map or plan drawn by Theo. Koss and made a part
 hereof and herewith filed in the office of the Clerk of the District Court for the County of Dallas. In
 consideration that the Houston and Texas Central Rail Way Company make their depot and
 station on the land designated for their use on said map have granted given and dedicated
 and do by these presents grant give and dedicate unto the said Houston and Texas Central Rail
 way company all that certain piece or parcel of land named known and designated on said
 map as "Rail Road Reservation" and being a strip of land running through said tract according
 to said Map along the line of the railroad track and on each side thereof to have and to hold
 the same unto the said Houston and Texas Central Railway Company forever to be held occupied
 and enjoyed by said Railway Company in such manner and for such purposes not inconsistent
 with its business as its officers and agents may see proper. The strip or parcel of land so de-
 signated on said Map as Rail Road reservation shall be a continuous strip or pieces not intersected
 by any street or way. All other streets and ways laid off and designated on said map by names
 and running at right angles with said "Rail Road Reservation" shall not cross but shall abut
 upon and terminate at said Rail Road Reservation on both sides thereof. The said Rail Road Reserva-
 tion may be used as a public highway only so long as the same remains open and unenclosed upon
 the express condition however, that the rights of the Railway Company in the use and occu-
 pation thereof shall be paramount. Nothing in this deed shall be so construed as to prevent the
 proper municipal authorities from grading ditching paving or otherwise improving said land
 as a street so long as the same remains open and unenclosed may erect and maintain
 a convenient number of crossings and bridges over the Railroad at such places only
 however as shall best suit the convenience of said Railway Company and be designated by
 its officers and agents. That the said Railway Company in their use and occupation of said
 Strip of land or for the improvement thereof shall not in any manner be subject to the work-
 mances or regulations of the municipal authorities of said town but the said land or
 Rail Road Reservation shall by such municipal authorities be regarded as the private
 property of the said Railway Company over which the rights and dominions of said
 company shall be paramount. The said Railway Company shall have the right
 to erect warehouses or any other buildings whatever upon said land designated as
 Rail Road Reservation and at any time hereafter to fence in and enclose said land or
 any part thereof and hold the same to the exclusion of the public and we do hereby
 give grant and dedicate to the public use as highway such portions of each of said
 streets and alleys other than the Rail Road Reservation laid off and designated
 on said map as may be contiguous to or adjoining any lots or blocks of land
 so laid off on said map which has been or may here after be conveyed by said
 Trustees to any other person, all other streets and alleys designated on said map
 or portions of them not contiguous to lots conveyed by said trustees to be
 remain the private property of said Trustees or their successors or assigns
 and may be replotted or closed up at their option. Witness our hands this
